

N. S. S college, ottapalam (Accredited with A status by NAAC), affiliated to the university of calicut, is one of the Arts and science colleges under the management of Nair service society founded by Bharatha kesari Sri. Mannath padmanabhan. It was consecrated by swami vishadanadha, president of sree Ramakrishna Ashram, palappuram and was formally inaugurated by Mrs. prabhakaran thampur on 10th july 1961. In july 1962 it was upgraded and was shifted to the present site. The premises of the college consists mostly of donations from Smt. K.P.S. Menon and Sri. vapala sankaranarayanan Menon. Ever since its inception in july 1961, the history of the college is marked by excellence in academic activities, service to the community and accountability. It has its motto, "Lucerna pedibus meis" meaning, "The word is a lamp upto my feet." With its vision, "Lead me from darkness to Light", the college offers thirteen U.G and six post graduate programmes. It has been accredited in 2007 and has

celebrated its golden jubilee in 2011. The college is gearing up for re-accreditation.

Situated on the sprawling 41 acres on the left side of Palakkad - Ponnani road, four kilometers east of Ottapalam town, the college is noted for its greenery. The tall trees inside the college quadrangle provide ample shade and cool and ambience for teaching and learning activities. The college caters to the need of the students of Malappuram, Palakkad and Thrissur districts. Seventy percent of the students are girls and college is free from gender discrimination. The college women's hostel is a home away from home. All administrative and academic activities of the college are planned by the planning board and monitored and evaluated by internal quality assurance cell. The PTA helps to maintain a rapport between all stakeholders. Alumni association is a source of strength for the college. Consumer redressal cell, women's cell, anti-ragging cell, career guidance and placement cell and entrepreneurial development club are some of the clubs / cells functioning in the college. NSS units of the college work to create social awareness among the students. ASAP, a student support programme which concentrates on soft skills training and IT, runs with government

funding, is another attraction of the college. New initiatives of Higher Education Department, NWI and JSP motivates the students to emerge in life. An automated well-stocked library with browsing facility is the greatest attraction of the college. The college also runs innovative programmes like finishing school for the outgoing students. (B) TUTORIAL PROGRAMMES

Students of the college will be grouped in to batches of about 25 and each group will be under the charge of a teacher, designated as "group tutor".

(C) MEDICAL INSPECTION

1. Every students of Ist degree, Ist p.o classes will be medically examined by duly qualified doctors at the beginning of the year and every alternate year thereafter. And the principal will take appropriate action on the basis of the medical inspection report.

2. If any deficiency is pointed out by the doctor at the time of medical examination the student concerned shall undergo treatment or resort to such remedies as prescribed by the doctor failing which he/she may be removed from the rolls of the college.
3. If a student fails to present himself/herself for medical inspection at the appointed time his/her case will be reported to the university.

LIBRARY AND READING ROOM

- The college library is divided into the following sections.
(i) Reference (ii) general.

Regulations regarding reference library

The reference section of the library is a collection of the valuable books. These books are not lent out to students. They are permitted to make use of them in the reading room.

Reference book may be lent one day to member of the teaching staff with the permission of the professor in charge of the library.

Regulations regarding general library

The general library will be open from 9.00 am to 5 pm. Each student is given a library card which has to be deposited with the librarian on taking a book. The card will be given back when the book is returned.

Any book may be recalled at any time even if the period of loan has not expired. Failure to return the books on the due date entails a fine of 50 ps per day of delay for each book.

Marking on book in ink or pencil, spoiling or damaging binding, underlining of passage, writing or remarks etc. on the leaves of the book or on illustrations, tearing off pages, pictures etc. are punishable by heavy fines.

If any book is lost, damaged or mutilated the borrower shall be required to replace the book or pay such compensation by the principal.
